The April and May days follow on from the one day events we held last year, when we had requests to make these two-day events with a dinner on the first night. Thus a two day event with a dinner -trying it out for 2024! Some of the highlights of the two days

- An opening session in both locations with Elizabeth Dowling rsm, the theologian who
  has been assisting Emerging Futures deepen our understanding of our mission and
  ministry since the very early days;
- A panel discussion about our work with the Dicastery in Rome, and the EFCL model with the roles of the community coordinator, the canonical delegate and consultors
- A session for Emerging Futures staff working religious institutes
- An afternoon of breakout sessions where you get to choose three topics to explore further with people engaged in the EFCL process
- And so much more!

We expect that the staff of Emerging Futures will be joined by Member Representatives of the eight religious institutes who are the company members of EFCL, directors from the Board, our service partners and their staff. We invite religious and their lay colleagues interested in exploring the opportunities of Emerging Futures to join us for these two days. A full invitation is attached to this *Monthly Memo*.

The Transition Team took annual leave over December-January, so we were back to meetings from January 22. Six weeks in we are working with our service partners to clarify the transition milestones for 2024 and get back into gear after a few weeks away. We expect that a number of service partners will be petitioning the Dicastery in Rome for a canonical delegate this year.

Our work with the Canonical Delegate Network is continuing this year with our first meeting coming up on March 4. EFCL is working with a group of religious to create a network of those interested in the roles of Canonical Delegate and Consultor, seeking to address and explore all the issues about these roles. The roles are high-level and hands off in the EFCL model, but like all roles, we are discovering particular aspects as the roles are taken up and go live. This was one of the aspects of EFCL work in which the Dicastery staff expressed most interest when Anne Lane pbvm and Mary-Clare Holland op met with them in September last year. We have just written to the Dicastery requesting a meeting in September this year to continue our discussions. On March 4 we will be looking at our continuing exploration of the role of the canonical delegate, policies, remuneration, terms of reference for the Network, developing a Memorandum of Understanding for use between the two religious institutes -the one supplying the canonical delegate and the one receiving the canonical delegate.

Emerging Futures continues to connect with our international network of religious individuals and organizations that, like us, are coming to new understandings of what it means for a religious institute to come to completion. This edition entitled <u>Our Work is Loving the World</u> explores a question heard frequently among women religious today as our demographics shift is: "What does mission mean for us today especially when fewer of us are engaged in ministry?"

The question is an important one. We live in a time when vast numbers of sisters are in a stage of life where they desire to live the mission that has drawn them for decades, but they no longer have a tangible ministry through which they express that mission. So many sense that the mission is indeed still alive within them but are unsure what that means in their daily living. - LCWR

It seems to us that this question of the meaning of mission today is such an important one, whether we are in the Emerging Futures process or not -it is a question for all religious institutes. *Occasional Papers* has a number of responses to the question what does mission mean today that will be a rich source of reflection.

As we move into the Lenten season, we wish for you time to ponder the invitation to turn ourselves back to God, to engage in a healing process of prayer. Let us welcome Lent as a season of grace, in which our hearts can be softened.
